VMFA Receives Federal Grant

Relocation and renovation will help preserve textile collections

The Virginia Museum of Fine Arts was recently awarded a federal grant from the Institute of Museum and Library Services (IMLS). The Museums for America grant in the amount of \$132,320 will assist with the purchase of a compact shelving system, additional cabinets and other shelving units, and in contracting two part-time registration assistants and a consulting conservator. The purchases and contracts will aid in the effort to consolidate collections stored in two adjacent art storage rooms into one newly renovated area of the building.

The art storage room will house textiles, unframed Tibetan thangkas, and Asian screens and scroll paintings. The African textile collection is the area with the greatest need of re-housing, with more than 100 objects. The relocation of these objects will improve staff access to the collection and allow for enhanced environmental conditions. The improved storage room will be key to their preservation and supports VMFA's strategic plan for collections management. This project will begin in October.

IMLS Museums for America grants are highly competitive. From 17,500 types of museums, zoos and botanical gardens, 244 were awarded grants this year totaling \$30 million. VMFA was one of only four Virginia institutions to receive a grant and with the second highest award amount for the state.
