ART ACTIVITIES (ongoing)

- Create a Maasai-Inspired Belt | Art Education Center Studio 1 (Level 1) Use beads to create your own colorful Massai-inspired belt!
- Create a Hunter's Shirt Design | Art Education Center Studio 2 (Level 1) Create your own miniature paper shirt to show off your bravery and personality. Add special messages on the inside of your design.
- Create a Zulu-Inspired Beaded Necklace | Conference Room 1 (Level L) Learn about Zulu beading designs and make your own beaded necklace. Include a secret message or "love letter" pendant!
