Dates Set for VMFA's Signature Fine Arts & Flowers 2024 Exhibition and Gala

Held at the Virginia Museum of Fine Arts Since 1987, Fine Arts & Flowers Benefits VMFA's Initiatives

Richmond, VA — The Virginia Museum of Fine Arts (VMFA) announced that their highly anticipated signature event, *Fine Arts & Flowers*, is scheduled for Oct. 23 through Oct. 27, 2024.

Held biennially since 1987, *Fine Arts & Flowers* is a spectacular museum-wide exhibition of floral designs inspired by works of art in VMFA's permanent collection. The event is presented by The Council of the Virginia Museum of Fine Arts, VMFA's oldest volunteer group, with creative floral designs by the Garden Club of Virginia, The Virginia Federation of Garden Clubs and Ikebana of Richmond.

Fine Arts & Flowers kicks off with a dazzling gala and preview of more than 70 floral interpretations of art throughout the museum. Other special events and programs include talks from renowned guest speakers and VMFA curators, luncheons, floral design workshops, exhibition tours, a fashion show and a variety of family activities.

Freeman Library. The Council organized the first *Fine Arts & Flowers* exhibition in 1987, which has since become a biennial event.

VMFA, which opened in 1936, is a state agency and privately endowed educational institution. Its purpose is to collect, preserve, exhibit and interpret art, and to encourage the study of the arts. Through the Office of Statewide Partnerships program, the museum offers curated exhibitions, arts-related audiovisual programs, symposia, lectures, conferences and workshops by visual and performing artists to schools, museums and other institutions throughout the Commonwealth. In addition to presenting a wide array of special exhibitions, the museum provides visitors with the opportunity to experience a global collection of art that spans

more than 6,000 years. VMFA is also home to important collections of Chinese art, English silver, and French Impressionist, Post-Impressionist, British sporting and modern and contemporary art, as well as renowned South Asian, Himalayan and African art. In May 2010, VMFA opened the James W. and Frances G. McGlothlin Wing I after a transformative expansion, the largest in its history.
