Parking



Students will hone their drawing skills by working from live specimens, and occasionally photographs, of a variety of flowers, plants, and seeds. Learn to examine structure in nature and translate that structure into drawing while focusing on composition. Botanical demonstrations in a variety of mediums will be included in this course. Students will work in graphite to begin

with and expand into colored pencils. Learn about the history of botanical illustration while studying a diversity of artists.

Learn a wide variety of watercolor techniques while using related drawing mediums in this course for beginning and experienced watercolor artists. Students work directly from the still life, landscape, and other subject matter, with discussions of color and watercolor masterworks offering inspiration. Individual and group critiques provided.

Students also learn to simplify any subject matter by identifying color masses from which to develop realistic or abstract paintings.

Through demonstrations and open studio time, you'll learn how to layer textures, play with color, make expressive marks, and bring your artistic vision to life. Repeat students may choose to work on independent projects.

13 Mixed Media Illustration*

Make playful and colorful illustrations using familiar and unusual techniques and media. In this lighthearted class, you will learn to generate ideas for imagery, simplify drawings while adding personality, make a portfolio to hold experiments and samples, and create finished art. Students will develop an intuitive feel for mixing and using color. Techniques include painted-paper collage, stencils and masks, smudging and scribbling, oil pastel and crayon, simple printmaking, and fun ways to add lettering and words to your art.

14 The Language of Color: Theory for Painters & Designers*

In this color class designed for beginners, professional artists, and aspiring designers, students complete a series of exercises using The New Munsell Student Color Set. Assignments will aid students in better understanding of color use, mixing, color schemes, and selecting colors for personal projects, as well as creation, manipulation, and organization of colors. The color theories of Albert Munsell and Joseph Albers will be discussed along with the color world of Pantone. Students may choose to work with watercolors, acrylics, or oil paints.

19 Drawing Fundamentals*

Beginning artists and those wanting to brush up on their skills will discover the basics of drawing, including pattern and composition, light and shade, proportion, three-dimensional form, and perspective. Learning through demonstrations, discussions, and individual instruction, students complete multiple drawings working from the still life and landscape images. Soft vine charcoal (assorted sizes), 18 in. x 24 in. sketch pad, and a kneadable eraser are required.

20 Introduction to Collage*

Experiment with new techniques, materials, and more to make innovative collages. The teacher will demonstrate ways to design, mount, and present your artwork in this workshop designed for all levels of experience.

After learning the basics of one- and two-point perspective, explore the museum grounds with the instructor to practice sketching on site. Back in the studio, choose one of your sketches to refine using watercolor and ink. Previous experience with watercolor isn't necessary. The workshop is a great way to jumpstart a travel sketchbook or urban sketching practice.

22 Encaustic Painting & Mixed Media Lab*

Encaustic painting is an ancient process using molten, pigmented beeswax to create layered and luminous art. Designed for both new and experienced painters, the workshop teaches classic encaustic techniques and ways to combine them with contemporary painting techniques and mixed media. Discover collage, incising, texturizing, surface embellishment, and relief work, as well as how to combine oil paint, pastels, inks, watercolors, and gouache with the encaustic. Some materials included.

23 Drawing Flowers & Plants in Color with Oil Pastels*

Explore several methods for making acrylic pour paintings. These paintings are characterized by unpredictable swirls of colorful paint with a glossy finish. Please bring up to eight small painting canvases or panels that you can safely transport (not to exceed 11 in x 14 in.), one quart of white semi-gloss house paint, and four to six acrylic colors of your choice. Miscellaneous supplies will be provided by the instructor for a \$5 fee, payable at the beginning of the workshop.

26 Experimental Mixed Media*

Experiment with various painting and drawing media. Explore new ideas, techniques, and imagery. Students will work on individual projects with demonstrations from the instructor. This is a great workshop to recharge your studio practice.

27 Painting on Photographs: The Extended Image*

This workshop explores the use of photography with mixed-media applications. Students combine photographic materials (digital or traditional prints, photocopies, found imagery or old photographs) with oil paint to produce new and exciting imagery. The instructor demonstrates a variety of approaches, including surface supports and preparation, gluing techniques, surface alterations, paint application, varnishing, cold wax, and other surface treatments. Open to all levels of experience.

28 Introduction to Painting with Gouache Workshop*

1 session, Oct 11 Sat, 10 am-4 pm Studio School, 2nd floor \$95 (VMFA members \$80) | Limit: 10 Prerequisite: basic drawing & painting skills

This workshop is an introduction to painting with gouache, an opaque, water-soluble medium that is like watercolor. Gouache, which is applied in layers like acrylics or oils, offers highly saturated colors, flexibility, and spontaneity. The medium is great to use as a sketching medium to plan larger paintings or for finished artwork. 

65 Art and Eternity: The Visual Culture of Ancient Egypt

The art of ancient Egypt is compelling and mysterious to us; its viewers in the ancient world thought so, too. Its timeless serenity speaks of the never-ending order of the world and of the universe, an order that transcends the impermanence of the natural world and directs our minds and our senses to the everlasting world to come. In this series we will survey the history of ancient Egyptian art, from the inception of divine kingship in the early Dynastic Period, to the remarkable confidence of Old Kingdom portrait sculpture, through the imperial grandeur of the Eighteenth Dynasty and the strange and sophisticated art of the age of Akhenaten, to the continuance of the forms of Egyptian art under the rule of foreign empires.

66 Art of the Ancient Americas

Art was widespread across Mesoamerica and South America prior to contact with European cultures in the early 16th century. Ancient American cultures produced everything from monumental architecture to portable sculpture to body adornments. These pieces often drew the attention of early 20th century collectors, such as Diego Rivera and Frida Kahlo. This four-week course focuses on the art and cultures of the ancient Americas. from the Olmec in present-day Mexico to the Inka in present-day Peru. We will analyze the materials, techniques, and meanings behind some of the most iconic ancient American artworks and discover the appeal that they still hold for contemporary audiences.
