The Atrium has large windows, so there may be bright lights. I can cover my eyes or ask to borrow a pair of sunglasses at the Visitor Services Desk.



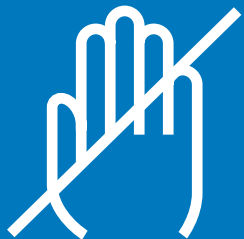


I will enter my classroom in the Art Education Center. I can hang my bag or coat on the coat rack. I will then sit on the carpet and wait for my teacher to give me instructions.

I may do art activities in the classroom. The art supplies may be messy, but that is okay. I can let my teacher know if I need help.



I will need to follow the museum's Visitor Policies. These rules are for my own safety, and they protect the art, too. Signs in the galleries will help me remember what some of these rules are.

Exceptions apply to bottle- or
breast-feeding of infants.



Leave Belongings:
Leave your bags
and coats with Coat
Check or in your
classroom.



Stick Together:
Walk slowly to keep
the group together
for safety and for
ease of discussions.



I will be in class with other students, so it may get loud. I can ask my teacher to borrow a pair of headphones or a fidget toy. If I get overwhelmed, I can go with an adult to a quiet space.

When it's time to leave the museum, my adult and I will exit through a door on Level 1. The museum has been so much fun, and I will come back again!
