

INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Cut out the four shapes to make up the elephant body.
- 2. Cut along the dotted lines shown on the shapes (6 cuts total).
- 3. Slide your elephant legs into the cuts on your elephant's body.
- 4. Slide ear shape into the cut behind the elephant's eye.
- 5. Decorate your elephant by drawing a saddle and jewelry to suit a maharaja, an Indian king!
