Create a *Güiro*, a Latin American Percussion Instrument!

A güiro is a percussion instrument from Latin America,

typically hand-made and hollow with a ridged side. *Güiros* were originally carved from wood, gourds, or bone. Modern *güiros* are created using plastic, wood or metal. When scraped with a stick along the ridged surface, they create a <u>rasping sound</u>. This traditional instrument can be heard in music around the world. Explore the rhythm and sounds of Latin America and create your own *güiro*!

Materials:

- Paper cup, or container, with lid
- Textured paper with ridges, such as bulletin board border paper
- Crayons
- Popsicle stick
- Optional: Recycled water bottle, empty ribbed can

Creating a Güiro

1. Glue the lid to the top of the cup or container. You may also use a water bottle or recycled ribbed can.







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2. Glue textured border paper around the sides of the cup, or container. This will give your instrument rough, textured sides. If using a water bottle or can, you do not need additional ridges.



3. Use crayons, markers, or paint to color and add designs to your *güiro*.



4. To play your *güiro*, rub the popsicle stick across the ridges along the sides of your instrument.

Texture refers to the feel of the surface on a work of art. Notice how this a creative element of design can be seen in both the artwork shown above as well as a *güiro*.
