III. VIRGINIA MUSEUM OF FINE ARTS (VMFA) ON THE ROAD/STATEWIDE UPDATES

Jeffrey Allison, Manager of Statewide Programs and Exhibitions and the Paul Mellon Collection Educator, reported on recent *VMFA on the Road* residencies throughout the Commonwealth, which feature the exhibition, *Revealing and Obscuring Identity: Portraits from the Permanent Collection*. He noted that the museum's current budget request includes funds to upgrade the Artmobile and its wheelchair lift. Mr. Allison encouraged Committee members to attend upcoming residencies in Gloucester, Chesterfield, and Madison.

IV. EDUCATION UPDATES

Director of Education Celeste Fetta announced that the weekly Dominion Energy Jazz Café is in-person again and now takes place on Wednesdays at 6pm in the Cochrane Atrium. She noted the success of the museum's June 11, 2022 African American Family Day, which featured on-site and virtual activities. The Education Committee then toured the museum's Memorial Foundation for Children Teaching Gallery's interactive exhibition, *A Closer Look*, which explores the ways various cultures use public art to share their history and identities.
