Choosing your materials: For the best experience I recommend that you purchase artist grade materials.

Here is some information for choosing oil pastels:

Oil Pastel Sets:

Caran de' Ache NeoPastels Oil Pastels, set of 12

I highly recommend this set, it is my all-time favorite, and the crayons are soft

and blend well. You are welcome to buy larger sets if you wish. Make sure they are oil pastels, not water-soluble crayons.

Cray-pays Oil Pastel Specialist set of 12

Crayons in this set tend to be a little harder and not as easy to blend, but workable.

Sennelier set of 12

This set is characterized by outstanding color. The crayons are very soft, like drawing with lipstick. I find them too soft for overall drawing and save them for

finishing touches.

Paper: 2 sheets, white, Stonehenge (22" x 30") Available Plaza Art Supply. I will show you how to cut them to a smaller size.
