**Drawing**: we will start with drawing to study basic anatomy before moving on to painting 9"x12" Drawing paper or sketchbook

Paint (oil/acrylic): student grade paint is okay, but artist grade will have a better color payoff

If you only want to buy a few tubes of paint, get the ones with \*

Cadmium Yellow
Hansa Yellow\*
Cadmium Red Medium
Alizarin Crimson / Quinacridone red\*
Titanium White\*

#### **Brushes**

Filbert – sizes 2, 4 and 6
Bright/Flat – sizes 2, 4, 6 and 8
Script liner (optional) – size 0 or 2

### Substrate

Stretched, primed canvas **or** primed wood panels, 11"x14" or larger Canvas pads for doing studies/practice (at least 9"x12")

### **Palette**

Disposable white paper palettes, size 12"x16" are the easiest solution Another option: Plexiglass palette & window scraper for clean up

## Medium

Acrylic:

Satin Glazing Liquid

Oil:

Odorless Mineral Spirits Liquin Original

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## **Other Tools**

Palette Knife for paint mixing

Acrylic:

Plastic cups for water (reuse old food containers)

Small plastic cups for mixing large quantities of acrylic paint (think jell-o/pudding cup size)

Oil:

Glass jars with lids for storing solvent
