Class space is limited. Registration is first come, first served. Please register early.

#### ADULT STUDIO & ART HISTORY CLASSES

Those who register for adult studio and art history classes must be 16 or older.

#### TEEN PROGRAMS, CLASSES, & WORKSHOPS

Studio classes are available for teens, ages 13-17.

#### CHILDREN'S STUDIO CLASSES

Includes studio camps and classes for ages 5–12. For programs beginning before 10 am, use the museum's Student Entrance.

#### EARLY CHILDHOOD PROGRAMS

Classes and camps for children 5 years and under, often accompanied by a parent. For programs beginning before 10 am, use the museum's Student Entrance.

DAY COURSES

#### **Basic Drawing: Step One\***


SARA CLARK

12 sessions, Sep 15–Dec 1 Tue, 1:30-4 pm Studio School, 2nd floor \$235 (VMFA members \$215) Enrollment limit: 10

This class helps students develop basic drawing skills through various techniques and materials, working from the model and other subjects. Class discussions and individual and group critiques round out the course.

#### Drawing in Color: Pastel\* SARA CLARK

12 sessions, Sep 17–Dec 10



Expand the use of color in drawing with soft pastels, employing various application methods and paper choices. Students work from the still life or subjects of their choice. Individual critiques provided.

#### Painting & Pastel Studio\*

12 sessions, Sep 16–Dec 9 Wed, 1-4 pm Studio School, 2nd floor \$250 (VMFA members \$230) Enrollment limit: 10

Prerequisites: basic drawing and painting skills

Learn to generate ideas, choose subjects, and adopt approaches to using paint and pastel. Students also work on independent projects, with guidance and individual critiques from the instructor.

#### Drawing in Color with Oil Pastels

12 sessions, Sep 15-Dec 1 Tue, 1–4 pm Studio School, 2nd floor \$250 (VMFA members \$230) Enrollment limit: 8 Prerequisite: basic drawing skills.

This class introduces oil pastels and paint sticks for painterly approaches to drawing. Students explore colored grounds, glazes, and various methods of layering color as well as color mixing and interaction.

#### Introduction to Painting\*

12 sessions, Sep 16–Dec 9 Wed, 9:30 am-12:30 pm Studio School, 2nd floor \$250 (VMFA members \$230) Enrollment limit: 10 Prerequisites: basic drawing skills

Learn to use direct observation when painting from life. Through demonstrations, observationbased painting exercises, and instruction,

beginning and intermediate artists strengthen their ability to see color and value relationships, and they learn how to mix colors accordingly. Students also learn to simplify any subject matter by identifying color masses from which to develop realistic paintings.

### Plein Air Painting\*

Mon, 1–4 pm Studio School, 2nd floor \$250 (VMFA members \$230)

Enrollment limit: 10 Prerequisites: basic drawing and painting skills

Explore drawing and painting from direct observation, photos, or sketches and depict various subjects including the still life, human figure, and landscape. Students develop a more personal approach to imagery, drawing, and painting styles by examining the formal and expressive aspects in their work and that of classical to contemporary artists. Most sessions will meet outside on the VMFA grounds, weather permitting. Students should provide their own plein air painting easel and stool.

#### Oil Painting: Independent Study\*

Prerequisites: basic drawing and painting skills

This is a great studio course for students at the intermediate level who are working to develop their own personal painting style and approach to imagery. Through individual guidance, students explore painting strategies and working methods.

#### Color & Abstraction in Painting\*

12 sessions, Sep 18-Dec 11 Fri, 10 am-1 pm Studio School, 2nd floor \$250 (VMFA members \$230) Enrollment limit: 10

Prerequisites: basic drawing and oil or acrylic painting skills

Expand technical and critical skills and learn to develop new ideas and imagery. The class will focus on using VMFA's 20th- and 21st-century galleries as points of interest and inspiration. In the studio, students will work from a variety of subjects, focusing on color and abstraction. Critiques and discussions of contemporary painting will also be included.

#### The Language of Color: Theory for Painters and Designers\*

In this color class designed for beginners, professional artists, and aspiring designers, students complete a series of exercises using The New Munsell Student Color Set. Assignments will aid students to better understand color use, mixing, color schemes, selection for personal projects, creation, manipulation, and organization. The color theories of Albert Munsell and Joseph Albers will be discussed along with the color world of Pantone. Students may choose to work with watercolors, acrylics, or oil paints.

#### Introduction to Collage\*

Prerequisites: basic drawing and painting skills

Using found materials, create unique images that range from abstract and dynamic to representational and poetic. The instructor will discuss materials, techniques, mounting, and presentation. Explore one of the most satisfying forms of visual play. Experienced students are also welcome.

### DRAWING & PAINTING WORKSHOPS

### A Drawing Primer\* MARIORIE PERRIN

2 sessions, Sep 19 & 20 Sat & Sun, 10 am-4 pm Studio School, 2nd floor \$145 (VMFA members \$130) Enrollment limit: 10

Beginning artists and those wanting to brush up on their skills will discover the basics of drawing, including pattern and composition, light and shade, proportion, three-dimensional form, and perspective. Learning through demonstrations, class discussions, and individual instruction, students complete multiple drawings working from the still life and landscape images. Soft vine charcoal (assorted sizes), 18 x 24-inch sketch pad, and a kneadable eraser required.

## Painting with Cold Wax Medium\* NEW!

2 sessions, Sep 26 & 27 Sat & Sun, 10 am-4 pm Studio School, 2nd floor \$145 (VMFA members \$130) Enrollment limit: 10

Prerequisite: basic drawing and painting skills

This workshop will teach students how to build beautiful textured surfaces using cold wax medium and oil paint. Experienced and beginner painters are welcome. The workshop will consist of demonstrations and hands-on practice. With guidance from the instructor, students will create small-scale studies and paintings using various techniques and leave with an understanding of how to use the wax medium to build gorgeous layered surfaces in future painting.

### Children's Book Illustration\* NEW!

## Encaustic Painting & Mixed Media Lab\*

Encaustic painting is an ancient process using molten, pigmented beeswax to create layered and luminous art. Discover collage, incising, texturizing, surface embellishment, and relief work, as well as how to combine oil paint, pastels, inks, watercolors, and gouache with the encaustic. **Some materials included.**

In this intensive class, students will study Sargent's artwork though slide presentations and by visiting VMFA's McGlothlin galleries. Working

in either watercolor or acrylic paint, students will complete color exercises, copy Sargent's work, and create their own compelling pieces inspired by Sargent's use of color.

#### Creative Nonfiction

Creative nonfiction, which is becoming the primary literature of the century, crosses many genres, including essay, memoir, and blog. This class will explore what constitutes creative nonfiction, using personal narrative and cultural conversation, while strengthening writing skills and confidence. Readings, exercises, and weekly assignments are also included. Students should download the ZOOM app to their computer or tablet to participate.

### Memoir Writing

This class merges these two notions that memories are heightened experiences that make us hunger for more. The instructor offers students encouraging feedback and specific writing prompts to help develop ideas.

## 33 Exploring Fiction ELIZABETH FERRIS

We are all storytellers. In this class, we will explore the joys of writing stories of our own making and creating characters and events that enrich our everyday world. Writing prompts, assignments, and discussion of the craft of fiction will benefit writers and readers at any level of experience. #### Fairy Tales, Revisited 4 DOUGLAS S. IONES

Why do folktales and fairy tales have such a remarkable staying power? Author and mythographer Marina Warner suggests that it's "because the meanings they generate are themselves magical shape-shifters, dancing to the needs of their audience." In this class we will read and discuss fairy tales, both traditional and revisionist. We will then explore ways to reimagine and repurpose them in our creative writing.

#### Writing the Shadow DOUGLAS S. JONES

Each of us has a dark self. Sometimes we glimpse it in dreams; sometimes we come to know it in our thoughts or imaginings. The aim of this course is to draw it out and see what we can learn from it. Students explore ways in which a realization of the shadow can open creative avenues for use in various writing exercises, including guided imagery, dream work, and active imagination.

#### Digital Photography for Beginners

JACLYN BROWN

Find out what white balance, resolution, and mega pixels are all about. This class teaches students to use their digital cameras more effectively, including the fundamentals of image capture, camera operation, proper exposure, and using a flash. Weekly assignments and sharing images in class help beginning photographers troubleshoot and develop a creative eye. Bring a digital camera with manual adjustments and the camera manual to the first class.

#### Intermediate Digital Photography

This class helps students refine both technical and creative photographic skills. Through discussions, class critiques, and weekly assignments, participants solve problems with exposure, low-light situations, and creative ennui, and learn time-saving methods for an effective digital workflow. A digital SLR to use in class is recommended but not required.

### Photo: Salon & Darkroom

6 sessions, Oct 27–Dec 1 Tue, 9:30 am-12:30 pm Studio School, 1st floor \$175 (VMFA members \$155) Enrollment limit: 8

Prerequisite: previous darkroom experience

This course is for students who want to pursue personal work while still becoming grounded in photo history and aesthetics. Most of class time will be spent in the open darkroom, with the instructor providing technical support and advice for short and long-term projects.

A 35mm camera with manual settings required. Darkroom fee included.

#### Introduction to Black & White Darkroom Photography

12 sessions, Sep 16–Dec 9 Wed, 7–10 pm Studio School, 1st floor \$250 (VMFA members \$230) Enrollment limit: 8

This class is for anyone who wants to get into the darkroom. Those with no or less recent experience will be taught the basics of developing film, making contact prints and enlargements. Topics will include mixing chemistry, enlarger operation, adjusting contrast and density, making photograms, contact sheets from negatives, editing, and printing enlargements. Students will shoot photos outside of class time and use the darkroom during class. Those with recent darkroom experience are also welcome and will receive feedback during lab time. Students must provide their own film camera, film, and photo paper. Photo chemistry will be supplied.

#### WORKSHOPS

#### Lighting and Photography Workshop NEW!

2 sessions, Sep 19 & 20 Sat, 10 am-4 pm Sun, noon-4 pm Studio School, 1st floor \$120 (VMFA members \$105) Enrollment limit: 8

Understanding light is one of the most important elements in creating compelling photographs. Seeing and controlling light allows a photographer to capture images that surpass a simple photograph. In this workshop, students will explore the possibilities of working with available light as well as altering and supplementing light using simple and inexpensive light modifiers. On day one, the instructor will discuss the use of light in photography including reflectors, diffusors, and on-camera flash. Students will then make photographs using varying light conditions. Day two will be spent reviewing and critiquing the images shot on day one. Students should provide a digital camera, a tripod, and any kind of lighting equipment available. Even a flashlight can work as a light.

#### iPhone Photography Workshop NEW!

Do you use your iPhone more than your digital camera to make photos? Learn from a photographer who uses his iPhone regularly in his studio practice. Students will learn the camera functions and will practice shooting during in-class exercises.




