Studio Class: Drawing with Charcoal: The Figure in Costume

Studio Class: Dolls, Fetishes, & Figures

Explore the mixed-media processes used to create dolls, fetishes, and figures in this intensive two-day workshop. The instructor demonstrates the use of armatures, sewing, sculpting, and painting, and invites students to try their hand at the various processes. She also gives a brief history of the doll and shows examples of her own beautiful creations. Some materials are included.
