# VMFA Announces Summer 2025 Slate of Special Events and Experiences

Must-see art exhibitions, fun family events, immersive dining experiences and live performances offered this summer

**Richmond, VA** — The Virginia Museum of Fine Arts (VMFA) offers an exciting slate of special exhibitions, events, programs and delicious dining year-round, and summer 2025 is no exception.

"Whether you are meeting up with friends, hosting out-of-town guests, traveling to Richmond or vacationing in your own backyard, the Virginia Museum of Fine Arts is the perfect destination for art, culture and fun this summer," said Director and CEO Alex Nyerges. "We are delighted to provide access to remarkable works of art from around the world and to introduce our museum to new audiences."

On view through September 28, 2025, the blockbuster exhibition <u>Frida: Beyond the Myth</u> is attracting visitors from near and far. The Richmond-based museum is one of only two institutions in the United States to present this must-see exhibition. Frida Kahlo's powerful paintings, embedded with vivid symbolism, along with insightful photographs of the artist by those who knew her best, convey the deeply personal contexts and events that inspired her art. The exhibition is accompanied by English and Spanish interpretive texts and audio guides.

Tickets for Frida: Beyond the Myth are \$20 for adults, \$16 for seniors 65+, and \$10 for youth ages 7 to 17 and college students with ID. Tickets are free for museum members, children ages 6 and under, Commonwealth of Virginia employees, and pre-K through 12th grade schoolteachers. Museums for All participants can purchase tickets at the reduced price of \$2 each, with a limit of four tickets per Electronic Benefits Transfer (EBT) card. As a participant of Blue Star Museums, VMFA also provides free tickets for all active duty, National Guard and Reserve military personnel and their immediate families.

No trip to see *Frida: Beyond the Myth* would be complete without enjoying artful Mexican-inspired cuisine at VMFA's award-winning <u>Amuse</u> restaurant or critically acclaimed <u>Floris</u> tearoom. The <u>VMFA Shop</u> offers unique merchandise featuring Kahlo's art and celebrating her cultural heritage.

## About the Virginia Museum of Fine Arts

The Virginia Museum of Fine Arts in Richmond, Virginia, is one of the largest comprehensive art museums in the United States. VMFA, which opened in 1936, is a state agency and privately endowed educational institution. Its purpose is to collect, preserve, exhibit and interpret art, and to encourage the study of the arts. Through the Office of Statewide Partnerships program, the museum offers curated exhibitions, arts-related audiovisual programs, symposia, lectures, conferences, and workshops by visual and performing artists. In addition to presenting a wide array of special exhibitions, the museum provides visitors with the opportunity to experience a global collection of art that spans more than 6,000 years. VMFA's permanent holdings encompass more than 50,000 artworks, including the largest public collection of Fabergé outside of Russia, the finest collection of Art Nouveau outside of Paris and one of the nation's finest collections of American art. VMFA is also home to important collections of Chinese art, English silver, French Impressionist, Post-Impressionist, British sporting and modern and contemporary art, as well as renowned South Asian, Himalayan and African art. In May 2010, VMFA opened the James W. and Frances G. McGlothlin Wing I after a transformative expansion, previously the largest in its history. A new expansion, the McGlothlin Wing II, is planned to open in 2028. Comprising more than 170,000 square feet, it will be the largest expansion in the museum's history and will make VMFA the fourth largest comprehensive art museum in the United States.

Recently named one of the 20 best art museums in the U.S. by *The Washington Post*, the Virginia Museum of Fine Arts is the only art museum in the United States open 365 days a year with free general admission.
