Page 104: Image credit should read McLean Museum and Art Gallery, Greenock.

Page 165: Provenance should read *Presented by Tsar Nicholas II to Field-Marshal General Count Dmitrii Alekseevich Miliutin in 1908.* 

Page 167: Marks for *Locket* should include *84 zolotnik*; Marks for *Scarab Brooch* should include *scratch inventory number 17925*.

Page 170: Marks for *World War I Dish* should read *Stamped* "K. Fabergé"; assay mark of Moscow, 1908-17.

Page 213: Marks for Bread-and-Salt Dish should read Imperial warrant mark of I. Khlebnikov and Company, assay mark of St. Petersburg before 1899 (dated 1888).

Page 226: Provenance for *Frame* (120) should begin *Sold January 15, 1898, to Tsar Nicholas II* and *Empress Alexandra for 165 rubles*.

Page 227: Marks for *Frame* (123) should include *scratch inventory number 54687*; Provenance for *Frame* (123) should begin *Sold January 28, 1897, to Tsar Nicholas II and Empress Alexandra for 110 rubles.* 

Page 237: Provenance should begin Bought in 1908 by Empress Alexandra 100 rubles.

Page 245: Description for *Frame* should read *The Photograph of King George V with the Prince* of Wales (future King Edward VIII), Tsar Nicholas II, and Tsesarevich Aleksei at a 1908 regatta in Cowles was added later.

Page 247: Provenance for *Frame* (151) should begin *Acquired on April 28, 1898, by Empress Maria Feodorovna for 83 rubles.* 

Pages 272-73: Captions should read, from left to right, *Elisavetinski Institute (1808); St. Petersburg Nikolaevskii Orphanage (1837); Ekaterininski Institute (1798); Pavlovski Institute (1853); Smol'nyi Institute (1764); Patriotic Institute (1827); Kseniinski Institute (1894); Moscow Nikolaevskii Orphanage (1837).* 

Page 309: Description should read *The silver plaque is engraved with a view of the Church of the Christ the Saviour in Borki, close to the city of Kharkuv, Ukraine*; Provenance should begin *Said to have been presented to Empress Maria Fedorovna to commemorate the erection of the Church of Christ the Saviour in Borki*; Note should be disregarded.

Page 328: Provenance for *St. Nicholas the Miracle Worker* (234) should read *only Lillian Thomas Pratt.* 

Page 345: Lion Pendant is marked inventory scratch number 11024.

Page 392: Marks should include *boar's head (French guarantee mark in use from 1838); unidentified maker's mark.* 

Page 393: Marks should include *boar's head (French guarantee mark in use from 1838); marks for foreign products in Latvia.*
